Single Public Service Pension Scheme: Instructions for Relevant Authorities concerning the collection and remittance of member contributions

Dear Personnel Officer,

Background

- 1. The Single Public Service Pension Scheme (SPSPS) commenced on 1 January 2013, as announced in <u>Department of Public Expenditure and Reform Circular</u> <u>19/2012: Commencement of the Single Public Service Pension Scheme</u>. That Circular indicated that further instructions would issue about the collection and remittance of pension contributions. This notification accordingly sets out instructions for all Relevant Authorities concerning the collection and remittance of the pension contributions of Single Scheme members.
- The Minister for Public Expenditure and Reform has made regulations designating Ministers of the Government along with specified public service bodies and bodies corporate as "Relevant Authorities" for the purposes of the Single Scheme (see <u>Public Service Pensions (Single Scheme and Other</u> <u>Provisions) Act 2012 (Relevant Authorities) Regulations 2012</u> (S.I. No. 581 of 2012)).
- 3. Relevant Authorities represent the paying authority or employer equivalent in the operation of the Scheme; their responsibilities include the collection and remittance of member contributions, the calculation and recording of accrued benefits, and communications with members. *Appendix A* provides a summary of these responsibilities, which can be fully accessed by referring to the <u>Public Service Pensions (Single Scheme and Other Provisions) Act 2012</u>.

Collection of member contributions

- 4. Single Scheme member contribution rates are as set out in section 16 of the 2012 Act. The standard rates which apply to most members are 3.5% of net pensionable remuneration and 3% of pensionable remuneration. However, as provided for in section 16(2) of the Act, Scheme members in the following "fast-accrual" groups have different contribution rates: Oireachtas members (including the President), the Judiciary, the Comptroller and Auditor General and qualifying and designated office holders, Gardaí, Permanent Defence Force personnel, prison officers and whole-time firefighters.
- 5. Contributions from all Scheme members must be collected in respect of each pay period and at each payroll run.

Remittance of member contributions

- 6. Relevant Authorities must remit member contributions on a monthly basis to one or other of the following two bank accounts:
 - (i) Paymaster General (PMG) Supply Account: For Relevant Authorities in sectors directly paid by Government Departments, including the civil service, Gardaí, Permanent Defence Force, and primary and post-primary (non-VEC) teachers, member contributions must be remitted to the Paymaster General (PMG) Supply Account. Details of this account are as follows:

Lodgements by Relevant Authorities to the PMG Supply Account must indicate that the funds lodged are proper to 301000.65710 (301000 being the "Superannuation Business Unit" and 65710 being the "Object Account"). Where such a lodgement is made by Internal Funds Transfer (IFT) please note that the relevant PMG Code is 780 SUPE.

(ii) Danske Bank account: For Relevant Authorities in sectors NOT directly paid by Government Departments, including State bodies / agencies, local authorities, VECs, universities, Institutes of Technology, and clerical and maintenance staff in community and comprehensive schools, member contributions must be remitted to the Danske Bank account. Details of this account are as follows:

Lodgements by Relevant Authorities to the Danske Bank account will be transferred monthly to the PMG Supply Account, so as to comply with section 16(5) of the 2012 Act, which requires contributions to be "disposed of for the benefit of the Exchequer".

7. Remittances must be made in respect of each calendar month by the 20th of the following month. Remittances should be made once per month. There is no scope for a Relevant Authority to withhold remittances of member contributions, notwithstanding any arrangement that may currently apply in the case of other public service pension schemes.

- 8. Relevant Authorities must prepare and retain details of contributions deducted from each Scheme member in connection with each monthly remittance. These details should be entered into the Excel spreadsheet which accompanies this notification (see screenshot at *Appendix B*); this completed spreadsheet must be emailed each month to the Department of Public Expenditure and Reform at singlescheme@per.gov.ie. The spreadsheet file name should be in the form: "RA-NNN-JAN13.xls", where "NNN" is the reference number of the Relevant Authority in <u>S.I. No. 581 of 2012</u> (e.g. 006, 043, 177), and "JAN13" is the month of contributions deduction (not the month of remittance).
- 9. Information will be provided to Relevant Authorities in due course as to how they can avail of restricted access to information in the account to which they remit contributions (PMG Supply Account or Danske Bank account as appropriate) concerning their lodgements into that account.
- 10. A schematic outline of the collection / remittance process set out above is provided at *Appendix C*; it illustrates the process separately for (i) relevant Authorities who remit to the PMG Supply Account and (ii) relevant Authorities who remit to the Danske Bank account.

Circulation and queries

- 11. Please bring this notification to the attention of public service agencies / bodies operating under the aegis of your Department, ensuring in particular that it is sent to all Relevant Authorities.

Appendix A – Key responsibilities of Relevant Authorities in the operation of the Single Scheme, as provided for in the Public Service Pensions (Single Scheme and Other Provisions) Act 2012



16 <i>Contributions to scheme, etc.</i>		 A relevant authority: may be required by the Minister to make a contribution where a body is self-financing – (4); shall pay contributions to or for the benefit of the Exchequer in a manner directed by the Minister – (5); may have unpaid contributions recovered by the Minister in court – (6); may be directed to dispose of contributions by High Court – (7). 			
17	Return of contributions in certain cases.	 A relevant authority may be required to facilitate the return of pension contributions to a member in specific circumstances and subject to particular conditions: return of contributions where vesting period not completed – (1); return of excess contributions where member paid in respect of more than one full-time (aggregated) employment – (2); rate of compound interest to charge on re-payment of contributions with consent of the Minister – (3)(c); discretion to accept re-payment of contributions in more than one payment - (4). 			
19	Calculation of retirement benefits.	This section provides that applications be made to a relevant authority to receive a pension and lump sum for members with standard accrual terms.			
20-26	Calculation of retirement benefits – President; qualifying office holders; holders of judicial offices; C&AG Oireachtas members; designated office holders; members who may be required to retire early.	These sections provide that applications be made to a relevant authority to receive a pension and lump sum in the case of members with non-standard (fast) accrual terms.

28	Preservation of benefits.	 A relevant authority must be satisfied that a preserved pensioner applying for retirement on medical grounds would, if still serving, be eligible for such retirement. A relevant authority must be satisfied concerning the medical evidence supplied before agreeing to payment of retirement benefits in cases of retirement on medical grounds - (3). A relevant authority may agree to a repayment schedule of lump sum in cases where a medical grounds retiree is reappointed - (9).

31	Obligation to pay benefits.	Calculation and payment of pension and lump sum for a Scheme member is a function of his or her relevant authority, subject only to any reassignment of such function by the Minister.				
32	Payment of pension, etc.	 Responsibilities of relevant authorities concerning pension payment: payment of pension in arrears - (2); payment of pension and lump sum in the case of a person who by reason of mental or physical disability is unable to give a receipt for the amount of such payment - (3); requirement to be satisfied that a person is a registered medical practitioner – (6). 				
34	Grant and payment of survivor's pension.	A relevant authority must be satisfied that cohabitation has ceased before granting or re-granting a survivor's pension – (2)(b)(ii). A relevant authority may be directed or instructed by the Minister in specific respects concerning the payment of a survivor's pension – (4), (5) and (6).				
36	Children's pension – beneficiaries.	The Minister may delegate to a relevant authority a function to give a direction, on compassionate grounds, to regard a person, who is married, in a civil partnership or cohabiting, as a child for the purposes of payment of a children's pension - (3).

A relevant authority may pay a children's pension to persons having care of a child in proportions which the relevant authority may determine, where more than one person has care of the child – (3). A relevant authority may be directed or instructed by the Minister regarding the determination of the class or classes of person to whom a children's pension may be paid – (4) and (5).				
38	Children's pension – conditions for payment, etc.	Subject <i>inter alia</i> to the Minister's discretion, a relevant authority may pay a children's pension even where the normal conditions imposed would not permit it be paid, if it is considered just and equitable in all the circumstances – (4). A relevant authority may be directed or instructed by the Minister regarding the conditions under which a children's pension may be paid – (5) and (6).
